Pre-AP Pilot Program

- CFA is among four schools in Arkansas to be asked to join the College Board Pre-AP program and is one of
 only about 100 hundred schools in the nation selected to pilot the new Pre-AP initiative. The second cohort of
 the Pre-AP program, which launched Fall 2019, offers instructional resources, classroom-based assessments,
 high-quality professional learning, and focused practice for schools that earn an official Pre-AP designation
 from the College Board. In order to receive the designation, schools must agree to:
 - Align instruction to the course frameworks;
 - Give students the digital assessments provided by College Board;
 - Take part in professional training; and
 - Offer the course with open access.
- For the 2019-2021 school years, CFA will be a part of the 2nd Cohort of the Pre-AP Pilot Program by College Board. We will be offering the brand new Pre-AP <u>English I</u> and <u>Algebra I</u> courses to all on-grade-level students at CFA.
