- Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress. (Stacy Allen 501-743-3567)
- The school will provide to parents reports/report cards every nine weeks with information regarding their child's academic progress and upcoming classroom and school events. (Stacy Allen 501-743-3567)
