#### Academic Improvement Plan: AIP

ADE (Arkansas Department of Education) NO LONGER requires districts to create AIPs for students based on the Spring 2017 IOWA test results.

#### **Individual Reading Instruction Plan: IRI**

ADE (Arkansas Department of Education) still requires districts to create IRIs for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students showing a substantial reading deficit based on the Spring 2017 IOWA results. These students score below the scale score of 135.

# NEW: K, 1<sup>St</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade State Assessment 2017-2018

- Under Arkansas Act 930, kindergarten students will now be assessed. They will not be screened with QUALLS.
- The contract for the K, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade state assessment has been determined for the Cabot School District. It is a 3 year contract paid by the state.
- Districts chose from 3 vendors. Cabot chose NWEA:MAPS.
- NWEA:MAPS replaces the IOWA, which was given only in the spring.
- The new assessment will be electronic on chromebooks.
- Students will take the assessment 3 times during the year.
- MAPS will access "growth" not "mastery".



- The assessment individualizes as students progress. This allows a student to begin at an appropriate level and progress to their own personal academic level.
- Progress is measured using the RIT scale, which reflects the level of questions successfully answered.
   Questions progressively increase in difficulty.
- These reports will enable teachers to monitor growth as well as identify strengths and weaknesses of their students.
- MAPS data is used to make instructional decisions for students. It is not designed to compare students to students, districts to districts, or for testing accountability.






## G/T and AP Grows

- For the first time in CPS history, we administered more than 750 AP Exams in a testing season.
- 22% of AP exams administered last year resulted in a score of 1. This is slightly higher than the 19% in 2016, but is explainable by an additional 83 exams administered.
- 64% of our students who took AP Exams earned a 3 or higher on at least one of their exams. This compares to 37% of Arkansas students who took exams.
