**Improvement Plan Focus Area:** The school implements a tiered instructional system that allows teachers to deliver evidence-based instruction aligned with the individual needs of students across all tiers. We will focus on implementing elements of RISE and our newly adopted literacy curriculum, Wit and Wisdom.

**Priority Area:** Based on the identified focus area, what issue needs to be addressed to achieve the goal?

Classroom, SPED, and reading teachers will be trained in RISE and Phonics First. These teachers will be expected to fully implement what they have learned in order to increase student success. Third and fourth grade teachers along with SPED will receive training on Wit & Wisdom and begin implementation in their classrooms. Wit & Wisdom will be piloted in 1st and 2nd grades.

All students will understand the importance of reading for life and not something we just do at school. They will seek opportunities to deepen their understanding in multiple content areas.
