- Eastside Elementary will distribute a bi-monthly newsletter to parents that is developed with participation of the parent-school organization, principal, staff, and parent volunteers. It includes school news, a calendar of school activities, and parenting tips related to school achievement such as homework tips, organizational skills, and study skills. - Eastside will create a Website to house pertinent information, including school news and upcoming school events. Parents are also able to access their child's grades with their student account number. Parents may use e-mail to communicate with members of the school staff. Parents are also informed of school news and events via the Eastside Twitter and Facebook pages. (Madison Darr, ongoing).
- Eastside Elementary teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress. (Teachers, ongoing)
- Eastside Elementary will provide to parents reports/report cards every nine weeks with information regarding their child's academic progress and upcoming classroom and school events. (Teachers, ongoing)

- Parent/Teacher Conferences: Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in their classrooms. Parents will be given a summary of the student's test scores and an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will also be given suggestions for coordinating school-parent efforts and explanations of homework and grading procedures. Parents will engage in discussion of how they can support their child at home. Conferences are scheduled at various times (3:15-7:00) during the day or evening to better accommodate parents. - Grands Family Night: Eastside Elementary will host a special evening to recognize grandparents and families. Guests are given the opportunity to have learn about daily school activities, visit the classrooms and activity rooms, enjoy a hot dog supper, as well as enjoy playing games together as a family. - Scholastic Book Fair: Families have an opportunity to attend the book fair with their children to purchase books and encourage the love of reading among students. Volunteers are able to help set up/tear down the book fair, as well as assist students/families in purchasing books. (Rachel Hammett, Fall 2019 and Spring 2020)
- Academic Nights: Eastside Elementary will host a special opportunity for families to participate in engaging activities that are aligned with classroom curriculum.
