- Cabot Junior High teachers received two hours of professional development to enhance their understanding of effective parental involvement strategies during the 2018-2019 school year. The principal and assistant principals received three hours of professional development designed to enhance understanding of effective parental involvement strategies and the importance of administrative leadership in setting expectations and creating a climate conducive to parental participation.
- Cabot Junior High South will continue to follow state guidelines for family and community engagement professional development requirements.
