All teachers will be trained in Illustrative Math. These teachers will be expected to fully implement what they have learned in order to increase student success. Illustrative Math will be in full implementation in K-4th grade classrooms.

Students learn by doing math, solving problems in mathematical and real-world contexts, and constructing arguments using precise language. Teachers can shift their instruction and facilitate student learning with high-leverage routines to guide learners to understand and make connections between concepts and procedures.
