MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 23, 2024 BOARD OF EDUCATION CABOT SCHOOL DISTRICT

Board President Sarah Owen called the meeting to order at 5:59 p.m. Those in attendance were school board members Corey Williams, Pam Clem, Joe Trusty, James Hertzog, Marvin Jones, and Kevin Tipton. Also, in attendance were Dr. Tony Thurman, Michael Byrd, directors, and community members.

The Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence were led by fourth grader Lanna Linderman.

CONSENT AGENDA

Minutes from the regular December 12 meeting were approved as presented. December financials were approved as presented. Motion by Corey Williams, second by Joe Trusty; passed 7-0.

RECOGNITION

School Board Recognition Month – The Cabot High School forensics team performed a special school board readers theater for School Board Appreciation Month.

Master Board Member Recognition – Board members Pam Clem, James Hertzog and Marvin Jones were recognized for achieving the Master Board Member designation from the Arkansas School Board Association (ASBA). Master Board Member designation is earned when a board member has completed 50 hours of ASBA training credits.

Student Spotlight — David Anderson from Central Elementary was recognized for his hard work, good choices, and academic growth since the beginning of the year. Lanna Linderman from Magness Creek Elementary was recognized for her leadership and drive to teach others about dwarfism. Jordan Cruce from Junior High South was recognized for his determination and improvements from the beginning of the year.

PLC Building Recognition —Liz Savage from Central Elementary was recognized for her wonderful contributions in the PLC process and her data exploration. Kristen Steinmetz from Magness Creek Elementary was recognized for developing a character education program that is being used at Magness Creek and other district schools. Lynn Turner from Junior High North is special education teacher and was recognized for working closely with general education teachers to keep students with special needs learning in the general education classroom.

CURRICULUM REPORT

PLC/Student Academic Performance Report – Aaron Randolph shared that 67% of Central Elementary students have reached the meeting/exceeding level in their reading scores. Magness Creek Elementary has seen a drastic decrease in the number of discipline reports and growth in their reading scores from the beginning of the year. Junior High South has already seen a major decrease in the number of disciplines referrals to the office.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

School Board Training Hour Report – Dr. Thurman reported that all seven school board members have met the required training hours for 2023.

Buildings and Grounds Report – Michael Byrd shared that the ribbon cutting for Cabot Learning Academy was held this evening prior to the board meeting. The Middle School North driveway is open and operating well. The practice pavilion site on Bellamy is being leveled and electrical lines have been moved. Remodeling has started on the old CLA building as it transitions in the child development center. The pre-k buildings will go to bid next month, and inclusive playgrounds are continuing to be installed.

Legal Transfer Approvals – Dr. Thurman reported that 5 students were approved for incoming legal transfers and 2 students were approved for outgoing legal transfers.

SUPERINTENDENT PRE-ACTION REPORTS

School Board Legal Liability Program – Dr. Thurman reviewed the school board legal liability renewal documents that were sent by Cadence Insurance.

Winter Guard Items for Sale – Dr. Thurman presented a resolution to approve the sale of winter guard items to other school districts and remove these items from the district inventory. Board member Kevin Tipton left the meeting.

2024-2025 Calendar — Aaron Randolph and PPC President Vicki Thompson presented the 2024-2025 draft students and 190 faculty calendars. It is an alternate format calendar with some snow days built in, and the first day of school would be August 20.

2024-2025 Pre-K Tuition – Dr. Thurman and Pre-K Director Suzie Kelley presented two options for the 2024-2025 pre-k tuition. One option was a flat rate of \$160 per week and the other was a sliding scale based on family income. They explained that

the pre-k programs receive revenue from four sources: tuition, Arkansas Better Chance (ABC) grant, Childcare and Development Fund (CCDF), and Essential Worker grant. The Essential Worker grant will not be available after the 2023-2024 school year.

The board voted to approve the school board legal liability insurance agreement as presented.

The board voted to approve the resolution to sell used winter guard equipment to other school districts as presented and remove these items from the Cabot Public Schools inventory.

Motion by Joe Trusty, second by Pam Clem; passed 6-0.

The board voted to approve the 2024-2025 student and 190-day faculty calendars as presented.

Motion by Corey Williams, second by James Hertzog; passed 6-0.

The board voted to approve the 2024-2025 pre-k tuition rate based on the flat rate of \$160 per week as presented.

Motion by Marvin Jones, second by James Hertzog; passed 6-0.
