## MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 19, 2025 BOARD OF EDUCATION CABOT SCHOOL BOARD

Board President Sarah Owen called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m. Those in attendance were school board members Sally Beebe, James Hertzog, Kevin Tipton, Pam Clem, and Joe Trusty. Also, in attendance were Michael Byrd, Aaron Randolph, Dr. Ben Darley, directors, and community members. Board member Marvin Jones was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence were led by Christina Teo, representing our custodial department.

#### RECOGNITION

**Backpack for Kids Program** – TJ Davidson from Cabot Church of Christ presented the district with a \$10,000 check for the backpack program. The Cabot Church of Christ raises money each year to provide for students in need. In the past 20 years, they have donated \$170,000 to this program.

Custodial Employee Recognition – Aaron Reed, director of custodial services, recognized Christina Teo for her outstanding work in the department. He said Christina is a great leader in every position she has been in and is very dedicated and committed to her work.

**Maintenance Employee Recognition** – Justin Skidmore, director of construction and maintenance, recognized Josh French for his positive attitude and hard work in the department. Josh has been with the department for a little over a year and has been a great asset.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

Minutes from the regular July 22 and special called August 5 meeting were approved as presented. July financials were approved as presented. Motion by Joe Trusty, second by James Hertzog; passed 6-0.

#### **CURRICULUM REPORT**

**Secondary Summer School** – Alana Graham reported that we had 258 total course enrollments in summer school this year. Summer school was offered for grades 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> for credit recovery or accelerated courses (PE, computer science, etc.). Twenty-one total credits were recovered during the summer session.

**Extended School Year** – Andrea Mendoza shared that ESY is offered at no cost to families in accordance with a student's IEP. The program is designed to prevent regression and is not summer school or credit recovery. There are 13 factors of eligibility, and a student must meet a minimum of three be considered for the program. The program was held at Westside Elementary this summer for five weeks, and they had 59 students participating.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

**Legal Transfer Approvals** – Michael Byrd reported that 10 outgoing legal transfers and 30 incoming legal transfers were approved.

**Buildings and Grounds Report** – Michael Byrd reported that we are finishing up punch list items on the two pre-k buildings. We have submitted plans to the city for a new stacking lane at Middle School South and plans for the press box at Panther Stadium.

SUPERINTENDENT PRE-ACTION REPORTS

**National Fitness Campaign Project** – Aaron Randolph reported the district is requesting to partner with Cabot Parks and Recreation to establish a 38' x 78' fitness court by the tennis courts behind CAO. Mr. Randolph and Travis Young, director of Cabot Parks and Recreation, attended the A & P Commission meeting to request funding for this project. This fitness court will be a community facility, but it will also be beneficial to PE classes at the surrounding schools.

**School-Based Health Clinic MOU** – Michael Byrd presented a MOU between the Cabot School District and Unity Health for the school-based health clinic.

**Resolution to Sell District Property – Food Service** – Michael Byrd presented a resolution to sell food service equipment on GovDeals and remove these items from the district's inventory.

#### **ACTION**

The board voted to approve the resolution supporting the use of approximately 38' x 78' of real property along South Polk for use of a Fitness Court through the National Fitness Campaign, with the understanding that the project will be funded through the efforts of Cabot Parks and Recreation and grants.

Motion by Joe Trusty, second by James Hertzog; passed 6-0.

The board voted to approve the school-based health clinic MOU between the Cabot School

District and Unity Health for a period of one year beginning on August 1, 2025. Motion by James Hertzog, second by Sally Beebe; passed 6-0.

The board voted to approve the resolution authorizing the sale of district property from the food service department as presented and remove these items from Cabot Public Schools' inventory.

Motion by Kevin Tipton, second by James Hertzog; passed 6-0.

The board voted to approve personnel as presented. Motion by Kevin Tipton, second by Joe Trusty; passed 6-0.
